
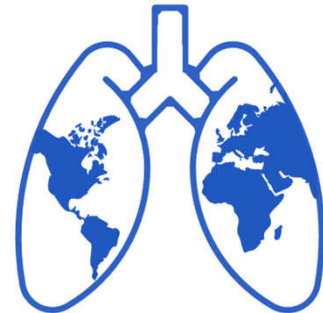

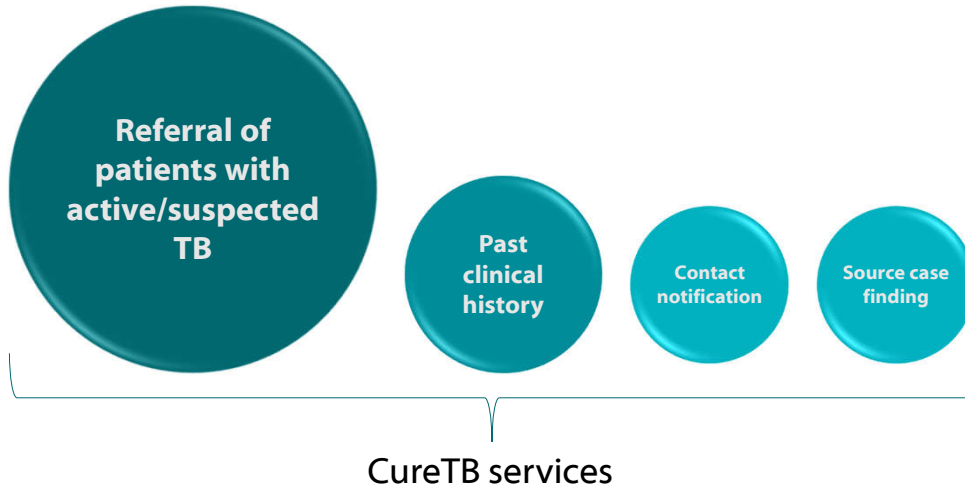
TB Along the Border Planning
CureTB Referral Process



CureTB has a primary goal of improving continuity of care for TB patients who cross international borders.

Through this work, CureTB aims to reduce global TB morbidity and transmission.

CureTB's work focuses on linking TB patients to care outside the United States.



CureTB receives referrals through email and confirms within 1 business day.

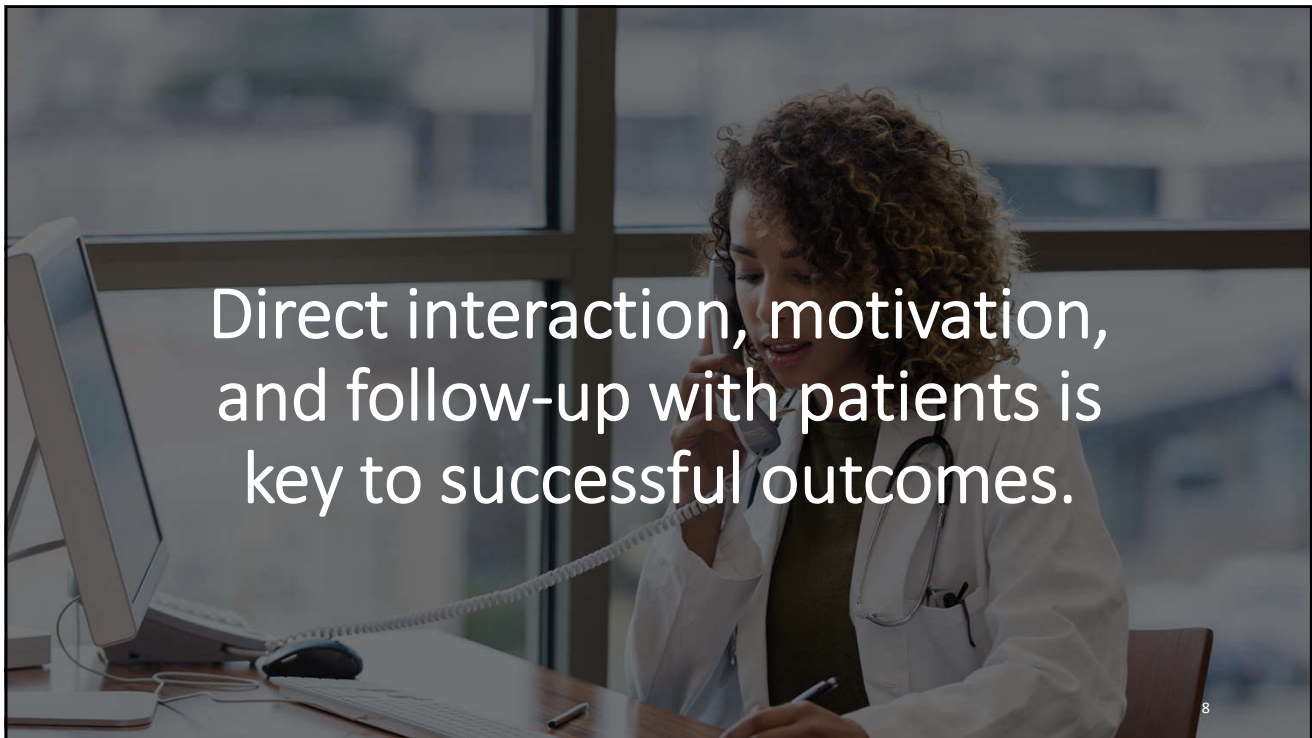
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Tips to facilitate successful referrals and outcomes
