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# THE ROLE OF THE TB PROGRAM

# CASE MANAGEMENT OF ACTIVE TUBERCULOSIS CASES

## CARE COORDINATION & PROGRAM SUPPORT

### Within Program Scope

- Manage records
- Provide resource connections
- State reporting
- Maintaining communication across the care team
- Patient education
- Provider consultation

### Outside Program Scope

- Assist in application of health insurance

## DIAGNOSTIC ASSISTANCE

### Within Program Scope

- Sputum collection and lab coordination
- Ensure follow up testing is completed on time, including imaging and blood work

### Outside Program Scope

- Induced sputum collection
- Blood draws
- TB testing, including TST and IGRA

## MEDICATION MANAGEMENT

### Within Program Scope

- Directly Observed Therapy
- Assistance with securing medication refills
- Monitor potential side effects and report to provider

### Outside Program Scope

- Prescribe or dispense TB medications

# ADDITIONAL SERVICES

## LTBI ASSISTANCE

### Within Program Scope

- Directly Observed Therapy for high risk LTBI patients
- Patient and provider education

### Outside Program Scope

- Case management for non-high-risk individuals
- Prescribe or dispense LTBI treatment

## CLASS B EVALUATIONS

### Within Program Scope

- Domestic evaluation
- Patient education
- Provide resource information
- Recommend treatment or further follow-up when appropriate

### Outside Program Scope

- Prescribe LTBI or active TB treatment
- Further diagnostic evaluation

# THE GOTCH LAW

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Health and Safety Code §121362 states that all health facilities shall not discharge, transfer, or release a patient until notification and a written plan has been submitted and approved by the Local Health Officer for all people known or suspected to have active tuberculosis.

- Follow up appointments with Infectious Disease and Primary Care
- 30-day supply of all TB medications in hand
- Confirm isolation ability and provide education
